

Paul Hannaby 15/3/2025 by Rob Sheehan

Paul's demo was all about using Pewter to enhance turned projects. He uses Casting Pewter (Tin 91%, Copper 1/2%, Antimony 8 1/2%) from the Pewter Sheet Company. A 1Kg bar of Pewter costs £35 to £40. Due to the weight, Paul usually buys 10Kg at a time. He sells 750g bars for £25. The casting pewter stays bright. Other

pewter mixes can dull over time. Paul said that it was possible to melt pewter on a stove but the 230°C to 250°C melting temperature is difficult to maintain. He prefers to use an electric

melting pot (designed for casting bullets), where the temperature can be accurately maintained. Paul's "Lee IV" melting pot currently retails for about £130. For safety, he wears welding gloves and goggles when using the pot. Paul uses either MDF for his moulds or high temperature silicon. The MDF contains no moisture so it doesn't erupt when in contact with hot pewter. Natural timbers, even when kiln dried, can contain moisture. The MDF also turns well and therefore makes good moulds. However, when releasing


the pewter from the MDF moulds, Paul has to turn away a narrow band either side of the pewter so the mould cannot be used to produce multiple copies. High temperature silicon is flexible so, once the pewter has been cast, the mould can be opened up to release the casting without damaging the mould. Paul uses a matching set of silicon moulds for his threaded box inserts.




Pouring the melted pewter into the mould. The mould must be kept flat to ensure an even pour. Paul uses a spirit level to check this.



The bowl rim cast in pewter. Note the uneven surface. This must be cleaned up before use. Paul doesn't cast directly onto the bowl as the hot pewter can scorch the wood.







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Paul cuts a tenon on the rim of the bowl to fit into a recess cut into the pewter ring. This gives a mechanical hold as well as increasing the gluing surface.

Paul has a thin 2mm parting tool that matches the gap in the tenon cutting tool. This is used to create the matching recess in the pewter rim.

The bowl and pewter rim ready for gluing. Paul normally uses epoxy resin for this.





THE MAIL ORDER

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The surface of the pewter is turned smooth using a round nose scraper first, followed by a flat scraper. The side of the bowl and the edge of the pewter are then turned flush.

Paul then hollows the centre of the bowl and turns the inside of the bowl and the inside edge of the pewter ring flush.





The rim can be left sanded to 400 grit for a brushed metal effect or Autosol metal polish can be used to create a shiny finish.

The hollowed bowl and pewter rim trimmed flush. When sanding, Paul sands the wood first, then the pewter to avoid moving pewter dust onto the wood. He uses cellulose sanding sealer and cuts back with 0000 wire wool.





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High temperature silicon moulds to create pewter box inserts. The silicon is flexible so the insert can be removed and the mould used again and again. The resulting pewter inserts are very rough and need cleaning up. After cleaning, Paul chases threads on the inserts to create a threaded box.

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


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Matching box inserts







Box with pewter threaded inserts. Note the grain match. This is achieved by removing fractions from the shoulder of the external threads. Or by removing fractions from the end of the internal thread insert.

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- New adjustable "Super ring" allows ultra efficient wood removal without clogging.
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Pouring a pewter finial.

Mould has a 19mm hole drilled down the centre but not all the way through.

Two more 10mm holes are drilled in from the side to intersect with the 19mm hole. One about 20mm in from the start of the 19mm hole and one at the end. One 10mm hole is to pour the pewter in. The other is for the air to escape.

A plug of dense wood is turned to block off the open end of the 19mm hole.




Once hardened. mount the mould between centres and turn away the wooden mould. Be careful of the



blank, ready for turning.

The sprues are cut off and re-melted for the next project.


