Mick Hanbury Demonstration 19/11/22 by Rob Sheehan

Mick has demonstrated at the club on several occasions. He now tries to produce more artistic work like wall hangings and cabinet pieces rather than functional bowls that, no matter how nice, will never fetch the same price



Mick started with a very unbalanced Horse Chestnut burr about 10" diame- ter. First he prised off all the loose bark. This left a blank with almost 1/3 miss- ing on one edge. Working at 650 rpm, Mick used a 1/2" bowl gouge and brought it more into balance so that he could increase the turning speed for a better cut. The tail stock provides extra safety
Mick cut a chuck spigot and shaped the outside to a gentle curve. His finishing cut was made with a newly sharpened 1/4" bowl gouge. Mick sanded using a rotary sander as sanding by hand would be dangerous with so much timber miss- ing. Wet sanding with a beeswax/oil mix kept the dust down.
Mounting the piece on the chuck spigot, Mick started on the face side.

Mick hollowed out the bowl start- ing at the edge. He cut down no more than 1" and made sure the wall was an even thickness. He then cut down another 1". By the time he had reached the centre, the outside was very flexible and had moved so it would be impossible to go back and refine the edge again.
Not so obvious on the picture. The oiled bowl has a deeper colour. Mick recommended Odie's Oil. It needs to be used very frugally (as it is quite expensive) and it feeds and strengthens the wood.
The finished bowl - for display, not use. Sanded and oiled.

Mick's second project was a Sunburst platter. The reverse was turned with a chucking spigot and an ogee shape. Sanded and finished with Mick's own beeswax and oil mix.



After turning the face side to a shallow convex curve and sanding, Mick masked the face with Frog Tape. This is better than masking tape for keeping a sharp edge.



Mick used a Iwata Nero airbrush $(\pounds 60)$ and cheap airbrush paints $(\pounds 30 \text{ for } 12)$. The Iwata compressor $(\pounds 500)$ was set to 20 psi. The first colour was yellow. This was flooded all over the unmasked areas..

The next colour was Red. This was concentrated at the base and lighter sprays towards the edges. Blue, black and grey followed.



Mick then applied gear wheel stencils (available from Axminster) to give a Steam Punk look. These were outlined or shaded in black and white.



The finished piece. Tape removed and wax/oil mix applied. Surprisingly, it didn't lift the paint. Enquiries Welcome. Mick's third project was a shield wall hanging from 10" Sycamore. He first turned the back with an undercut rim to allow for wall mounting. He also created a 50mm chuck recess. Because wood turners will also look at it, Mick also decorated the back. He would not normally do this as it will never be seen.

Mick then turned, sanded and sealed the face. Note the defined rim and outer centre. These areas will be natural timber on the finished piece.



Jo Sonja's irridescent colours work best on a dark background. Colours are applied darkest first to lightest. Mick applied two coats of chestnut ebonizing lacquer followed by one coat of clear gloss melamine lacquer.

Mick played around with various designs. Scales (seen here) tyre tread and finally leaves.

The blue was mixed equal parts with flow medium. The green was mixed with approx 25% flow medium and the yellow with only a little bit of flow medium.





The final shield. The rim and outer centre has been cut back to natural wood. They have then been textured with a Sorby texturing wheel. Two coats of Chestnut Melamine lacquer seal the shield.

Mick's last project of the day was a square bowl in spalted Maple. He cut a chuck spigot and turned a simple curve on the outside. Just right of centre you can see a black ring with a white centre. This is silica (hardened sand) which took the edge off Mick's gouge very quickly. He had to keep going back to the grinder to re-sharpen his tools.

Mick then turned the inside. Taking lots of care to get the wall thickness even, Mick left a rim on the centre bowl. This adds a shadow and improves the look of the piece.



The final square bowl. Sanded and oiled with Mick's beeswax and oil mix. Sorry about the camera distortion, the bowl really was square.

Austin and Rhodes Trophies

As December approaches and hopefully the Austin and Rhodes trophies will be awarded, we thought past, current and future recipients would appreciate a quick update. Originally the trophies were donated to Coombe Abbey Woodturners following the births of two grandsons to the late member, Cliff King. Time has flown by since then and the boys are now young adults in their own right, but still enjoy reading the Coombe Abbey Woodturners magazine to find out who has been awarded their respective trophies!

Both are now professional ice hockey players, combining their sport with studying at degree level. Austin (age 21 years) is in his second year at Loughborough University studying Automotive Engineering, and Rhodes (age 19 years) has just started at Warwick University studying Manufacturing and Mechanical Engineering. Both boys attended The Hill Academy in Toronto after their GCSEs, in order to pursue their ice hockey careers alongside their education, but after leaving High School, Austin's signing with Brampton Admirals in Ontario didn't materialise due to the pandemic, so he returned home. Fortunately, his GB U18 opportunities weren't affected, although one year at U20s was, and he holds an IIHF World Championship Gold Medal at U18s, and Bronze at U20s. Rhodes on the other hand managed a gap year after his A level equivalents, playing out in the States for Wisconsin Rapids Riverkings in the USPHL, but sadly was unable to represent his country at U18s despite being selected, again due to the pandemic. However, last year he made the GB U20s team, returning with a World Championship Bronze medal and has just secured a place in this year's team and will travel out to Kaunas, Lithuania to take part in the IIHF World Championships 11-18th December. As it'll be his last chance at U20s level, we hope Team GB will be in the medals one way or another!

Austin played his first professional role (as a Forward) for Telford Tigers last season, helping them to win the National Ice Hockey League (NIHL is Tier 2 in the UK), even scoring the penalty shot winner in one game where both regulation and overtime resulted in a draw. Due to travelling logistics he has moved to Peterborough Phantoms for the 2022-23 season, and is enjoying the new challenge. Rhodes secured his first professional role this season, being head-hunted by Austin's former Coach, and is now a key Defenceman for Telford Tigers. It goes without saying that both players do a lot of travelling to games and training! Last season Austin was also on a two-way contract with Coventry Blaze in the Elite League (Tier 1), and this year they have also secured Rhodes on a similar contract (see photo). To say the least it's a challenge trying to maintain studying at degree level alongside their professional commitments, but if you really want something, then strive you must!

Therefore, we hope this resumé will be of interest to the current membership and we wish you all continued success with your wood working endeavours and every good wishes to the Club going forward into 2023.
