Steve Heeley Demonstration 16/6/23 by Rob Sheehan

We are very grateful to Steve for demonstrating despite a mix up on dates. The very hot evening demonstration at Shilton was well attended. Steve's project for the evening was a candlestick in Oak. He showed us one he had made earlier. This one had a threaded box in the middle. Steve said that he could turn threads by hand but prefers to use Simon Hope's



threading jig. The reliability of a threading jig means a piece is not wasted when hand turned threads go wrong. Steve mounted a 6" diameter x 2"

thick blank on a screw chuck. Using a bowl gouge, he trued up the edge and face of the blank. Using dividers, Steve marked the size of a chuck recess and used a parting tool to cut the recess. He then used a spindle gouge to turn the waste wood in the centre of the recess into a button. Steve then used a skew chisel to dovetail the sides of the recess. By using a shear scrape, Steve got a very god finish off the gouge so he could start sanding at 240 grit. Paste wax was used as a finish.

Using the recess to mount the



candlestick base on a chuck, Steve demonstrated how to turn an ogee shape on the edge. This being one possible design for the base. However, Steve then changed the design to have two steps, one of which was turned into a bead. Steve marked the size of the stem (approx 50mm) and drilled a 25mm hole 15mm deep using a forstner bit for the stem spigot. He then shaped the base into a gentle curve, ensuring that the area around the hole was flat or slightly concave.

Moving on to the stem of the candlestick, Steve mounted an Oak blank 10" long x 4" diameter between centres. He had already drilled a 1" hole

Steve Heeley Demonstration - continued

in one end. The drive centre was placed into this hole. At the tail stock end, Steve turned the 25mm spigot and turned a short section to 50mm diameter to match the mark on the base. He then glued the stem into



the base and used the tails tock to hold it in place while the glue dried over the tea break. After tea, Steve turned an urn shape at the bottom of the



stem. In his earlier candlestick, it was the urn that was a threaded box. Given he only had two hours to complete the project, Steve did not create a box this time. At the bottom of the urn, Steve turned a cove and two fillets. As the upper

fillet was a smaller diameter than the lower fillet, Steve explained that the cove in between was not symmetrical either. The centre of the cove is moved towards the upper, smaller diameter fillet. Steve refined the urn, cove and fillets until he was happy with their slimmer shape. Above the

urn, he turned another cove and two fillets. This led into a trumpet shape up to the top of the candlestick. Steve went over each shape, refining and slimming it until it all looked right. He then changed the upper fillet into a bird's beak.





Steve Heeley Demonstration - continued

Removing the tail stock, Steve turned the recess in the end to take a metal candle cup. The candle cup was made to sit just at the surface of the wood. Steve then used a Sorby texturing tool to texture the urn. He then

enhanced the texturing by "stabbing" the tool into the timber. He said it was necessary to press hard for hard timbers like Oak Steve sprayed Chestnut cellulose sanding sealer over the coves above and below the urn. This stops the ebonising lacquer bleeding through. from Masking above and below the urn, Steve sprayed Chestnut ebonising lacquer on the tex-



tured urn. Despite masking, he cleaned up the over spray by re-cutting the coves above and below the urn. Steve sanded the ebonised area with 180

grit to expose some of the clean wood. He sanded with the lathe running in



reverse so he could more clearly see the effect of the sanding. Steve brushed the textured area with a brass brush to clean the texture. As a perfectionist, Steve went back over all the shapes again, refining the join between the base and stem, re-cutting the coves and fillets till he was happy. He then sanded to 400 grit and used the long point of a skew to

crisp the joins between shapes. A coat of spray sanding sealer was cut back with 0000 wire wool, followed by a coat of paste wax. Steve then applied a final polish coat of 50/50 carnuba/beeswax. When buffing this,



he started at the top and moved down. A bit of pressure melted the wax and the movement only from top to bottom ensured no ridges of wax built up.

Steve Heeley Demonstration - continued

With 20 minutes left, Steve quickly turned an Acorn in Ash. The one he had turned previously, was a threaded box but time didn't permit anything but a basic Acorn.

Starting with a block of Ash 4" long x 2" square, Steve used a spindle roughing gouge to turn it to round. He then used a skew to mark the transition from acorn to cup. Steve used a spindle gouge to shape the acorn and a skew to undercut where it entered the cup. After shaping the cup, Steve textured it with the Sorby texturing tool. He then cut a bird's beak leading into the stem. Steve kept refining each shape until he was satisfied the proportions were right.

Pendants by Rob Sheehan

At the Daventry show, I saw some resin and burr wood pendants that had been turned by Emma Cook. She was selling the blanks for £5 each, so I bought four. Luckily, I caught the end of Helen Bailey's demo at Axminster where she was turning a resin and wood blank so I had an idea what to do. Since it has been a few years

since I have turned a pendant, I thought I would practise on some Corian before starting on the bought blanks. I cut the Corian into 2" x 2" pieces, the same size as Emma's blanks. I used double-sided carpet tape to hold it onto a scrap piece of Corian held in my chuck jaws. After turning it to round with a parting tool, I now had to hold it to shape it. Helen Bailey had used Axminster soft jaws to grip the edge of the blank. I didn't have any soft jaws, so I made my own using 10mm acrylic sheet and Axminster wood jaw plates. I cut a 50mm recess in the acrylic sheet and turned the inside of the recess to a concave shape to make room for the convex shape of the pendant. Holding the Corian blank in the recess, I could turn the face to a gentle curve. I then sanded and wet polished it with Micromes sanding pads, finishing at 12000 grit. This left a nice shiny surface. Holding the finished face in the recess, I trimmed the thickness of the Corian and curved the face. This was followed by sanding and wet polishing as before. I now had to cut an offset hole in the pendant. I removed jaws 2 and 4 from the chuck. I wound on jaw 1 but waited for the third turn of the spiral before winding on jaw 3. This gave me a repeatable offset that put the hole in a good position. I was using an Axminster SK114 chuck, which is large enough to take the offset while still providing plenty of grip to the offset jaws. I then used a spindle gouge to cut a 20mm hole that gently curved towards the centre. I sanded an wet polished again. I now marked the top of the pendant so that I could re-align it when I flipped it over to cut the hole from the other side, followed by sanding and wet polishing. I marked with a bradawl and drilled a 1mm hole about 3mm from the top of the pendant. This was to fit a clamshell pendant clip. A chain with clip finished the piece. I didn't turn an offset hole in Emma's blanks as that would lose the contrast between resin and wood.
