It was a mixture of Sadness and shock that we learned of the death of club member John Bradbury. An item he was turning came off the lathe causing a fatal injury.

John was a very proficient turner spending many hours per week at his lathe and the items he produced were varied and of high quality. He was well known for his segmented turnings giving demonstrations on this subject to many clubs around the midlands area.

I first met John in 2005 when he knocked on my door and introduced himself and then realised that I was also dabbling in segmented work but in a very amateur way. John only lived just around the corner from me. After he persuaded me to join Coombe Abbey Woodturners, I spent time in his workshop learning about segmented work. Many is the time when my phone would ring and it was John saying he had something in the lathe which I should see, so I would go straight around to his house and benefit even more from John's vast knowledge.

John leaves three daughters Kay, Elaine and Dawn and a much wider family. I am sure you will join with me in sending our condolences to them at this very sad and difficult time. RIP John Bradbury.

Most of you will be aware that sadly Colin passed away on 17th January.



Demonstration by Pat Hanley 17/02/2023

Club member Pat managed two projects during the evening session at Shilton. Pat's first project was a Pear in Sycamore. Using a spindle roughing gouge (SRG), Pat turned the 4" x 6" square blank to round





and cut a chucking spigot on the end. Holding the spigot in the chuck, Pat shaped the bottom to a concave shape and started to taper towards the top. He made the base concave and drilled a 3mm hole in what will become the bottom of the pear. Pat sanded 80g

to 240g and then used Yorkshire Grit while sanding down to 400g. This was followed by a coat of cellulose sanding sealer and two coats of

carnuba wax. Using a home-made screw chuck, Pat supported the base of the pear against some router mat to stop the screw chuck marking the wood. He then turned the top of the pear before sanding, sealing and wax-



ing as before. Pat then mounted a piece of Blackwood in the chuck and turned a stalk for the



pear. Using a thin saw to part off at an angle makes it look much more lifelike. A drop of super glue was used to hold it the top of the pear.

Pat Hanley Demonstration - continued



Pat's second project of the evening was a twice-turned bowl. The picture on the left shows a partially turned bowl from wet wood turned in 2014. It is about 3/4" thick and quite oval in shape. The bowl is turned again (hence twice-turned) once it has dried.

To re-turn it, the now oval bowl was held against a wooden disc covered with router mat. The tail stock was brought up and friction was enough to drive the bowl while a new chucking point was cut and the outside trued up. Pat also turned a separate foot for the bowl. Nearly 1/4" had to be removed before the outside of the bowl was round again. Pat used a 3-point tool to cut three decorative lines near the top. He then used some old Formica work top veneer to burn the lines. After sanding, sealing and waxing the inside, Pat mounted the spigot in the chuck and hollowed out the inside. Most of the hollowing was done with a bowl gouge. A rounded



cabinet scraper gave the final finish. Again, the inside was sanded, sealed and waxed. Pat finally removed the chucking spigot. To do this, he mounted a disc, covered in router mat, in the chuck and held the bowl against the disc using the tail



stock for support. A bowl gouge and spindle gouge removed as much of the chuck spigot as possible. Pat then decorated the foot with another three lines cut with the 3-point tool. Pat sanded, sealed and waxed the foot before carving off the last bit of the chuck spigot. A sanding disc arbor held in the head stock finally removed the last traces of the chuck spigot.

Since Pat spent a lot of time getting the bottom of his bowl perfect (he



knew wood turners would be examining it carefully), I have included a photo on the next page.

River Table

By Rob Sheehan

Last month, I described how a waney-edged board of Yew, bought at the Harrogate show, was transformed into a nearly-finished River Table. With this month's warmer weather,



I was able to complete the second pour of water-clear epoxy resin over the whole of the table top. Hairpin legs completed the table. The River Table now has pride of place in my lounge. The epoxy resin surface should be hard enough to take hot drinks but I'm not risking it and coasters have been strategically placed.

Conclusion

I'm very pleased with the result.

At about £200 in material costs and several weeks labour it is not a project for everyone. Working with epoxy resin is very messy but at least the one I chose was low odour so I could do the pour in my warm kitchen (I do live alone!).

I have another, smaller river table to make. The wood has already been prepared, so I only need to dye the resin and pour. I can't wait!

Child's Rocking Chair byRob Sheehan

The club competition at this year's Woodworks At Daventry show is a child's rocking chair. The club is collaborating to make one but I thought it would be a good idea to make my own. This is what I have done so far. Rockers still to be added.





Ash roughly cut to size. Bought at the Yandles show this year. 50mm thick, 8" wide and 6' long. Cost £35



Drilling holes #1

The pen centring vice once set up ensures the holes will be in the centre of the timber.

Child's Rocking Chair - continued



Drilling holes #2

The larger pieces are drilled directly as they are too big to fit in the pen centring jig



All holes drilled. I have added two extra spindles to give more support to the seat webbing.



Turning complete. Three beads added to the spindles.

Child's Rocking Chair - continued



Trial fit to make sure holes have been drilled in the correct place and all spindles fit inside the mating hole. Some tweaking was necessary.



All pieces ebonised using Chestnut ebonising lacquer and the grain enhanced with Chestnut gilt cream.



Chair finished. It is 25" high. Rockers still to be made and seat webbing to be added

Axminster's Sharpening Demo

Chris demonstrated three of Axminster's sharpening systems. The Tormek T8, the Axminster Professional Slow Running Grinder and the Axminster Ultimate Edge. Starting with a deliberately very badly ground bowl gouge, Chris soon had it sharp again.









Water-cooled stone sharpens at 240 or 1000 grit. Leather honing wheel. Jigs for sharpening just about everything.

New diamond/hard black and super fine Japanese stones available

Slow running grinder. Shown fitted with optional CBN wheel and Tormek jig arm. Allows the use of most Tormek jigs.

Also shown with optional Tru-Grind sharpening system.

Axminster's Ultimate Edge sharpening System. Uses abrasive belts to produce a "flat" grind. Forward or reverse running with variable speed. Different abrasive belts available as well as an optional buffing wheel adaptor.
