lic events after being cooped up at home for so many months. As more and more members of the public are getting vaccinated




against Covid-19 I am sure confidence will return and we will be able to look forward to a more normal life.



However after 19 months we were able to have a get together for a meeting/demonstration at the Walsgrave Baptist Church on Saturday 18th September where we welcomed Gianni Deidda to demonstrate his skills on the scroll saw. What a fantastic demonstration it was for all the members who had ventured out to enjoy it.

What followed amazed us all and I for one had not the slightest idea of what could be achieved on the scroll saw. Gianni asked for a show of hands

First off, Gianni cut out some shapes of a cat and a dog from thin pieces of wood which didn't surprise us too much but then he started to cut a image of a cat using a stack of pieces and these formed into a larger and quite interesting of those people who owned a scroll saw and quite a number of members raised their hands, then he asked how many used the machine on a regular basis and far fewer people raised their hands this time. Gianni said most people bought a scroll saw to do a particular job and then relegated it to a position under the bench not to be used for many months or even years and I am afraid that is exactly what I did not knowing its capabilities.

pattern. Gianni then went on to 3D work which I hadn't realised was possible on the scroll saw. To make it easier to hold the work and keep fingers clear of the moving blade Gianni had made a simple clamp out of pine and a couple of bolts with wing nuts. Patterns were glued to the piece of wood using a tack glue making it easier for clean up later. The choice of blades for given jobs and species of wood was explained in detail

one day demonstration but as the pictures accompanying this report shows many wonderful items can be achieved on the scroll saw given time and might I add, a little patience.

The day's demo sadly had to come to an end and we have to thank Jill Steedman and Alison Elliot for looking after us by their

blade. And talking of changing blades he informed us of the way he tensions them by pinging the blade with his finger and listening to the resultant tone emitted. This of course he admitted comes with experience.

Choosing the correct blade Gianni demonstrated cutting Copper and even thin Steel as well as Perspex.

Some items of work which Gianni passed around the room took many hours to complete therefore not suitable for a



Obituary Don Robins 1933 - 2021

Sad to report that Club member Don Robins passed away On Monday 30th August 2021.

Don joined Coombe Abbey Woodturners on 1st October 2006 and I was privileged to conduct an interview with him which was published in this magazine in August 2008 as part of the "Your



Turn To Talk" Editors interviews. As a tribute to Don I am re-producing that interview now which will reveal so much about this extraordinary mans life. I am sure all our members will join with me in sending our heartfelt condolences to Don's family.

RIP Don Robins Editor

Your Turn to Talk......Don Robins

(Editors Interview)

Don Robins was born in Salisbury, Wiltshire in 1933 and lived in several small villages around Salisbury.

Don was part of a family of eight and he says - 'brought up during the war years was a very poor existence.

On leaving school in 1947, Don started work in a local garage earning £1 per week. The famous Wilton carpet factory was only six miles from Don's home and they paid "Bobbin Boys" £3.50 a week - Don says that he wasted three years of his life at the carpet factory.

Living on Salisbury Plain, a very large military training area, Don saw the mass parachute drops in preparation for D Day and Arnhem and decided then that he would like to join the Army and in particular the Parachute Regiment when he was of age.

Don played a lot of football and was a very keen cyclist racing twelve and twenty five mile trials. This made him a very fit teenager which was going to help him a lot, later in his life.

Don say's - 'At age 17½ the time had arrived for me to fulfil my ambition

to become a paratrooper. I joined the army in 1950 and finally retired in 1998, a grand total of forty-eight years service. This consisted of twenty-three years in uniform followed by twenty-five years as a civilian instructor and examiner on driver training/maintenance of vehicles.

For the twenty-five years civilian service I was awarded the ISM (Imperial Service Medal)'.

Army days did not start too good for Don; falling on a cross country run he suffered a very deep wound to his knee and was hospitalised for several weeks. On his return to the training depot Don says, 'I was harshly informed by an officer that as I had volunteered for the Para Regt I should pack my kit and report to Aldershot for the very tough two week selection course'.

The football and cycling helped Don to pass the famous selection course and off he went to the RAF parachute school and become a parachutist. Later in his career he became a parachute instructor and managed to do a few hundred "jumps".

During his career Don was selected for several instructors positions, such as Sergeant to train basic recruits, (50% pass), Sergeant instructor at the Para Regt Battle school, Sgt Major Instructor to the Berlize (central America) police force (forming a defence force).

Don says, 'I did reach the top by being promoted to WO1 / RSM'.

so used to the Sgts greeting me with a very sharp 'Good morning Sir'., now the Sgts walked past, not a glance, life was going to be so different'.

Before Don left the Army he passed the driving test for the I.A.M. (Institute of Advanced Motorists) both for cars and HGVs. He also qualified as an MOTADI (Ministry of Transport Approved Driving Instructor) his driving and ran own (weekends/evenings) with a great success. Don Says -'So after 23 years the uniform and pace stick was put away. One day I was the Sgt Major everyone knew, the next morning I walked into a different army barrak as a civilian instructor. It was so different, I was

Don's life was going to be spent instructing soldiers, later the RAF and Navy, on driving all types of vehicles other than track vehicles.

In 1997 Don qualified as a driving examiner - Cars - HGV - Bus and Motor cycles. After 1000 tests it was time to retire. Don recently retired as a voluntary driver for the Walsgrave Hospital, after ten years service,



driving 8000 miles a year around and across Coventry, this he says became too much agro.

Don is now doing 2-3 days per week at the Age Concern workshops at the Gilbert Richards centre helping in the woodwork centre.

Q. When did you take up Woodturning?

It was mid 2006 when on a bird watching visit to Coombe Abbey, I met Roy Nicholls who had a lathe for sale. I have always been interested in woodwork. I was a bird breeder for 25 years so I was always building nest boxes and aviaries and I did love DIY although having lost my dear wife 5 years ago I have rather lost interest in DIY.

Q. How did you learn of Coombe Abbey Woodturners?

I have lived in Coventry for twelve and a half years and never heard of Coombe Abbey Woodturners until the day I met Roy Nicholls demonstrating at the Top Pool at Coombe. I had just gone along to do some bird watching which is another of my interests.

Q. What make of lathe do you turn on?

I started off with a Record DML 24 which I bought off Roy, but I have since upgraded to a Charnwood lathe bought from Chris Barker. It has variable speed and a swivel headstock, 900mm between centres and

about 310mm clearance over the bed.

Q. What other machinery and tools do you have in the workshop?

I bought a lot of turning tools from Roy but have acquired others from shows etc. I have a texturing tool which I haven't used yet but intend to

shortly. I have the BCT hollowing tool which I think is magic. With regard to machinery I have a bandsaw, table saw, pillar drill and lots of hand power tools.

Q. Have you had any professional tuition?

Yes, I have been on a number of courses. In June 2006 I went to Craft Supplies and did all eight of their varying courses. I used to go for a week at a time and did whatever was being put on. I have also been to Axminster for a course and also had two days intro into woodcarving, but am not too keen to take this up seriously. I have also spent many hours with Chris Barker at Middleton Hall. I have booked to go on the "Norwegian Woodturning Cruise" in August, and hope to get some Hands-On under the eye of a few professionals.

Q. Who do you admire as a demonstrator?

Mick Hanbury who taught me initially. I was very impressed with the demonstration of open segmented turning by Sue Harker, at Walsgrave recently, and hope to have a course with her next year.

Q. How much time do you spend at the lathe?

I am probably doing woodturning most days in a week but the hours per day vary quite a bit, I have spent as much as seven hours in a day in the workshop.

Q. What aspect of woodturning do you most enjoy?

I like making little boxes of one kind or another. I admire John Whittles work and would like to achieve his standard of design and workmanship.

Q. Do you turn green wet wood?

I have turned some but without much success. I like to start on a project and see it through to a finish, so I haven't the patience to turn a piece rough and go back to it six months later to finish it.

Q. What are your views on colouring wood?

I would love to do some colouring of wood.

Q. Have you done any Pyrography work?

No, but I am going to have a go and I shall be having some lessons with Bob Neil on the woodturning cruise.

Q. And Pierced work?

Yes I have done a little. I have a couple of Dremels which I use and quite like doing this work.


